



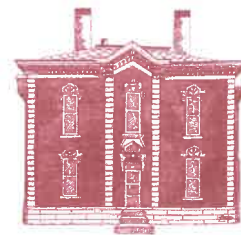

**THE MINUTES**  
**April 15, 2021**

The Holmes County Commissioners met in regular session Thursday, April 01, 2021; with everyone present. Chairman Ault opened the meeting:

**8:30 A.M. CHRIS YOUNG - ENGINEER – STANDING APPOINTMENT**

Young discussed with the Commissioners Quicksall is working on the plans for the Winesburg Sewer plant, putting the Berlin Sewer plant out for bid this fall and also discussed the Cherry Ridge that Ault and Young will be meeting with Sugarcreek concerning the waterline and that annexation into Sugarcreek is not an option. Young is also applying for grants for Cherry Ridge and applying for OPWC money to put the waterline in from Sugarcreek and it eventually will be turned into Walnut Creek Water.

Young did a sewer fact sheet and Commissioner Miller went over it with the other Commissioners.

**9:00 A.M. – LINDA CAMBELL, BOB TURNER AND ROCKY SNYDER – WATER AND SEWER DISCUSSION**

Linda Campbell of Nashville Village and Killbuck Village, Bob Tuner of Glenmont Village and Rocky Snyder of Holmesville Village met and discussed with the Commissioners funding for their sewer and or water plants.

Nashville would need at this point \$14,800.00 for the Engineering fees for a grant, Killbuck Village would need approximately 1.4 million for new water line to the Industrial Park, Glenmont Village would need approximately \$700,000.00 to \$800,000.00 for new waterline and fire hydrant replacement and Holmesville would need approximately \$60,000.00 to \$70,000.00 to update their sewer plants.

Ault informed them that they need a long-term plan for the water plants and the sewer plant.

There is no easy solution and we need to try and work together to get these things done.

The Villages also need to get a hold of their Representatives and see what they can do for them at the State level.

The \$ 8,500,000.00 in Stimulus money that the County will be receiving will be going toward the Winesburg sewer plant and upgrades to the Berlin sewer plants.

No decisions were made at this time.

**ADJOURN MOTION**

With no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Miller moved that the meeting be adjourned at 4:30 p.m.; Mr. Eyler seconded the motion (Mr. Ault – yes; Mr. Eyler – yes; Mr. Miller- yes). The next scheduled business meeting of the Holmes County Commissioners is Monday, April 19, 2021.
